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ADVISORY GROUP UPDATE



In 2023, the HEUG Community revolutionized a significant milestone in our organizational evolution – the transition from **Advisory Groups (AGs)** to **Communities of Practice (CoPs)**. This transformative journey reflects our commitment to enhancing collaboration, inclusivity, and the overall engagement of our community members.

A dedicated AG Taskforce, comprising passionate individuals from various sectors of our community, reviewed the structure, community engagement, and election process. This group recommended changes that align directly with the HEUG's on-going strategic plan; as well as the best way to serve the needs of the HEUG community with its core objectives for education and engagement across the broad range of technology and business process areas it represents.

ADVISORY GROUP UPDATE



KEY HIGHLIGHTS

EFFECTED ADVISORY GROUPS

Customer Relations Management (CRM), Finance (FIN), Human Capital Management (HCM), Product and Change Management (PCM), and Technical and Reporting (TRAG), Campus Academic Records Support (CARS) and Campus Student Financial Support (CSFS) will remain as Advisory Groups.

REBRANDING HEUG INTEREST AREAS

Following suit, the current 'Interest Areas' are under construction and will be rebranded to better align with the forward-direction of the CoPs early 2024.

PURPOSEFUL EVOLUTION

The move from AGs to CoPs is a purposeful evolution designed to foster more dynamic, responsive, and inclusive collaboration. It aligns with our commitment to staying at the forefront of innovation within the higher education space.

COMMUNITY-CENTRIC APPROACH

CoPs emphasize a community-centric approach, encouraging participation and knowledge-sharing among members with shared interests and objectives. This shift empowers our community to drive the agenda and co-create valuable resources and insights.

ENHANCED COLLABORATION

With CoPs, we aim to facilitate enhanced collaboration by breaking down silos and provide a platform for members to connect, exchange ideas, and collectively address challenges faced within their specific domains.

REVISED ELECTION PROCESS

This revision for the new advisory group members and the community of practice group members requires a balance of individuals for each detailed module within product systems. Each group will be required to identify the skillsets of members rolling off the team, allowing a detailed set of requirements to be advertised each election cycle which will now take place after the annual Alliance conference.

TRANSITION TO COMMUNITY COUNCIL

A new Community Council (formerly known as the All HEUG Advisory Group) had been designed to balance the commitment for sustained representation across all existing product system used by HEUG members, while preparing the organization to engage on future challenges and solutions.

ACKNOWLEDGING THE AG TASKFORCE

We extend our gratitude to the members of the AG Taskforce for their unwavering dedication, strategic thinking, and collaborative spirit. Their input and recommendations were instrumental in shaping the framework for this transition, ensuring that it aligns seamlessly with the evolving needs of the community.

EDUCATION UPDATE




This year we focused on several initiatives. The first was the finalization of a PS Query four-part series. The team developed, and professionally recorded the final 2 parts of the series. These are slated to be released to the HEUG community in January of 2024. Upon completion of the series participants will receive a badge to mark their accomplishments.

The second initiative was the development of a Business Analyst training. The first part of the year was spent gathering survey results regarding what types of skills and tools the HEUG community was looking to develop. Upon analysis and discussion, the working group decided to refocus the direction of the work. The working group felt it was important to first develop an active community to share and generate ideas based on topics selected from the survey results. The team offered their first coffee hour aimed at Business Analysts in November. It was well attended and received. The working group will be offering monthly coffee hours. This will help build the community and identify experts in various fields. These experts will be called upon to help with the development of a training series.

Lastly, we worked with our strategic partner, Information Technology Research Group to develop a series of executive level round tables to engage C Suite members. This effort resulted in a four part series of roundtables presented virtually in small groups to facilitate open discussion and sharing of ideas. These round tables covered Generative AI, General Technology Trends in Higher Education, Security Trends in Higher Education: and Annual HR Trends for IT. This roundtable series lead up to the Alliance 2023 C suite Forum.

GLOBAL COUNCIL UPDATE



The Higher Education User Group (HEUG) is the leading global user community in higher education with membership currently spanning 48 countries and with conferences in 2023 in the US and in Asia, Europe, Southern Africa and Australia and New Zealand.

- 7-8 September – Johannesburg, South Africa
- 30 October – 1 November – Brisbane, Australia

The theme of the 2023 international conferences was ***Renew and Rejuvenate – the future or our systems***. Attendance at international conferences this year was higher than in 2022, but work needs to be done to raise numbers to the pre-covid era.

GLOBAL COUNCIL UPDATE

Through use of the HEUG Global Council we were able to facilitate an exchange of ideas and offer help to the different regions in helping gear up the different conferences and to share lessons learned to help the other regions of the world. The most important lesson however, learned year after year is that regions may differ in local legislation and budget constraints (or opportunities), the main challenges that institutions face are similar worldwide. This offers opportunities for the HEUG to grow to new regions and countries. In 2023 we therefore took two new endeavours in this regard:

1. ARAB REGION

With thank to the open invitation of the University of Doha, preliminary efforts are underway to support a regional conference for the Arab region. The setting of this conference is planned to be in Doha, and organization will be done with support from the Ministry of Education of Qatar.

2. DIGITAL DATA TRANSFER

The HEUG Global Council. is currently exploring a conjunction of efforts with the GDN (Groningen Declaration Network) on how to transfer student data between systems without the use of paper. Through the global council we were able to share how Singapore has set this up using blockchain diploma's and how the Netherlands have digitalized the high school diplomas with the effect that university admission for Dutch nationals is paperless. Interestingly this new endeavor was set up as a result of the HEUG Canada conference in 2022, even though the GDN was started in the Netherlands.

The start of 2024 is geared towards further developing these endeavours while we work globally on setting up the new Communities of Practice of the HEUG. That this will prove, again, to be a global challenge can be seen in the first discussions that have taken place in the Integration Community of Practice at the end of 2023. That the HEUG is worldwide, proves year after year to be a wonderful asset.

REGIONAL TASKFORCE

In order to accurately align with the current Planning Committee’s areas of reach and to strategically recognize the HEUG as the hosting organization, a decision was made to rename all of the Regional Conferences. The renaming initiative reflects the current regionalization of membership and ensures consistency and cohesion within the HEUG. The “Alliance” name will only be referenced to the annual U.S. conference.







2024 LIFETIME ACHIEVEMENT AWARD

SUSAN BEIDLER

When approached to present the Lifetime Achievement Award to Susan Beidler, I was immediately consumed with the thought that there was no better person to offer this award to as a way of recognizing her years of dedication to the Higher Education User Group.

Susan was inducted into the HEUG Hall of Fame with the inaugural class in 2011. While there are no preconceived criteria for the Lifetime Achievement award it is important to present it when you find an individual whose body of work for the organization extended over the lifetime of the organization while constantly focusing on how to serve the members of the HEUG at a higher level than others. After being recognized in 2011 for 11 years of dedication, Susan's next 12 years had an even greater impact on HEUG members.



Susan began working at PeopleSoft in 1992. While her early years were focused developing curriculum and training customers on the core HR and Financials products, she finally came to the student system world in 2000 as the Product Strategy Director for the Student System. Over the years Susan was the one constant that HEUG members could rely on as Vice Presidents of the Student Product came and went. Susan trained most people she reported to over the years on the student product's intricacies.

While her focus was on providing service directly to HEUG members, Susan also had impacts at every level. Here is one example of the depth of Susan's involvement. While still working for Peoplesoft in the early 2000's Susan had a new Vice President for product who didn't care for the then name of the student product, which at the time was simply Student Administration. I recall sitting in Susan's office and the two of us discussing this. Susan always felt a great name for a student product was the name of the company that developed the product with the beta customers, which was Campus Solutions! Her new boss embraced the idea and soon after Peoplesoft's Student Administration product became Campus Solutions.

Susan's name can be found attached to thousands of posts on the HEUG Website and I've seen her present or be a part of presentations for hundreds of Alliance Sessions, Educause presentations, NASFAA conferences, as well as many others. Susan's impact was not felt only in North America. While she has presented and events in England, Spain, Colombia, Australia, Singapore and elsewhere around the world, she also helped these groups with their individual needs for the software. She clearly had an impact and was widely respected by the international community. It is impossible to identify every point of impact that Susan had while providing service to HEUG members. Her calm approach, during periods of change helped HEUG members often cope with unplanned complexities over the years. There was never a time, not even once, that I heard a HEUG member complain about Susan's approach.

I feel honored to be asked to write this and present this award to Susan. In appreciation for her years of dedication to the Higher Education User Group, this recognition of Lifetime Achievement is awarded to Susan Beidler.

FINANCIAL STATUS

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FINANCIAL STATUS

FY23 marked a significant rebound from the pandemic challenges, highlighted by the return of in person regional events.



The HEUG hosted three US regionals, and four international regional conferences. This return to regular operations was highlighted by our community's enthusiastic participation. Both conference and membership revenues saw an uptick this year. The choice of St. Louis for its cost-effectiveness played a key role in maintaining low expenses, enabling HEUG to conclude the year with a financial surplus.

The year ended with a positive net asset change of \$534,420. A notable 20% increase in membership revenue was driven by a revamped structure and enhanced corporate membership program for our vendor partners.

However, the HEUG's investment portfolio did not recover from the previous year's downturn, with a continued focus on bond investments reflecting a cautious investment strategy. This approach will be re-evaluated in the forthcoming year.

The board made a strategic decision to secure future event locations through 2028, acknowledging the necessity of advanced planning to accommodate the scale and specific requirements of HEUG events.

The annual financial review conducted by Gelman, Rosenberg, and Freedman (GRF) concluded without any management advisories, affirming the organization's sound financial management.
